## STEP 1: TURN TO GOD\_\_\_\_\_

"After this, the armies of the Moabites, Ammonites, and the Meunites declared war on Jehoshaphat... He was afraid, so he decided to ask the Lord what to do." 2 Chronicles 20:1,3 (NLT/NCV)

### STEP 2: TALK TO GOD\_

"Then King Jehoshaphat went and stood before them and prayed aloud..." 2 Chronicles 20:5b (GN)

#### • REMIND MYSELF\_

"Are You not the God who is in heaven? You rule over all the kingdoms of the nations. Power and might are in Your hand, and no one can withstand You." vs. 6 (NIV)

"Didn't You drive out those who lived in this land when Your people arrived?" vs. 7 (NLT)

"O God, won't You stop them?" vs. 12 a (NLT)

STEP 3: TELL GOD

"We are powerless against this mighty army that is about to attack us." 2 Chronicles 20:12b (NLT) STEP 4: TRUST GOD

"We do not know what to do, but our eyes are upon You." 2 Chronicles 20:12c (NIV)

#### WHAT GOD SAYS

"This is what the Lord says to you: "Do not be afraid or discouraged because of this vast army. For the battle is not yours, but God's!"" 2 Chronicles 20:15 (NIV)

#### STEP 5: THANK GOD
