MESSAGE 4: WHEN A SETBACK LEAVES YOU EMOTIONALLY EMPTY

"King Ahab told his wife Jezebel everything Elijah had done and how he ordered the death of all of her false prophets of Baal. So the queen sent this threat to Elijah: 'May my gods strike me dead if I don't kill you by this time tomorrow!' Elijah was afraid and he ran for his life; he left his servant in the town of Beersheba and he walked for a full day into the desert. Finally he came to a broom tree and he collapsed under its shade. There he prayed that he might die. He said "God, I have had enough! Take my life! Just let me die! For I am no better than my ancestors! Exhausted, he fell asleep under that broom tree. . . (later) Elijah told God 'I've always worked hard for you Lord, but your people have abandoned your covenant, destroyed your places of worship, and murdered all your true prophets. I am the only one left! And now they are trying to kill me too!"

MESSAGE 5: WHEN YOU FEEL LIKE GIVING UP

Parts 1-3

"So we rebuilt the wall around Jerusalem until it had reached half its original height, because the people worked at it with all their heart. BUT THEN the other tribes in our area heard about our progress and how Jerusalem's walls were being repaired and all the gaps were being closed. They became very angry and they all plotted together to attack Jerusalem and create some confusion to stop the progress. So we prayed to God for protection and posted 24 hour guards. But about that time, the people of Jerusalem began to complain. They said 'We're tired and worn out. We can't keep up this pace! Besides that there is so much rubble and trash to be removed. We now realize that we cannot finish this wall. Meanwhile our enemies are threatening to kill us in order to stop this work! GENESIS 37-50

Much of Joseph's life included a series of painful setbacks from his dream to do great things with his life. But God used them to position Joseph for a spectacular comeback that saved 2 entire nations: Israel & Egypt.

Now Jacob loved Joseph more than all of his other children because Joseph had been born in Jacob's old age. So, one day Jacob gave Joseph a special ornamented robe. When Joseph's brothers saw that their father loved him more than he loved them, they hated Joseph, and they would not even speak to him or acknowledge him. And when Joseph told his 11 brothers about a great dream from God, they hated him even more!"

GENESIS 37:3-5

"One day, when Joseph's brothers were out in the fields, they saw Joseph coming toward from a distance and they made plans to kill him. 'Here comes that dreamer!' they exclaimed. "Come on, let's kill him and throw him into a deep pit. We can tell our father that a wild animal attacked and ate him. Then we'll see what becomes of all his great dreams!"

GENESIS 37:18-20

"Then Reuben said, 'Let's not kill him, Let's just throw him into this pit in the wilderness. That way we won't shed any blood.' He said this, secretly planning to save Joseph and send him back to his father. So, when Joseph arrived, his brothers stripped him of his favorite robe and then tossed him into the pit which was a dry well, without any water in it,"

GENESIS 37:21-24

"After they threw Joseph into the pit, the brothers sat down to eat dinner. But then they saw a caravan of traders passing by, headed to Egypt, with camels that were loaded down with spices, balm and myrrh. Then Judah said to his brothers, 'We won't gain anything if we just let our brother die in this pit, and we'll all share in a murder cover-up. So why don't we do this: Let's sell off our brother to these traders! All the brothers thought that was a good idea. So, they sold Joseph for 20 shekels to the traders who took him to Egypt."

GENESIS 37:26-28

"Then the brothers took Joseph's robe, slaughtered a goat and dipped the robe in the blood. Then they took the robe back to their father and said, "We found this coat. Does it belong to your son?' Jacob recognized it and cried out, "Yes! Some wild animal must have killed Joseph and torn him to pieces! . . . Then Jacob sobbed for a long time. Everyone tried to comfort him but he said, 'I'll grieve this loss until the day I die.'"

"Meanwhile, in Egypt, the traders sold Joseph to be a slave of Potiphar, a man who was an officer of Pharaoh, the king of Egypt."

GENESIS 37:36

"Now Joseph was well-built and very handsome. After a while his master's wife took notice and began to lust for him. She begged, 'Come to bed with me!' But Joseph refused saying, '... How could I do such an evil thing and sin against God and my master?' And though she tempted Joseph day after day, he refused to go to bed with her or even be alone with her. But one day, when Joseph was working inside the house, none of the household servants were inside. So Potiphar's wife came up behind him and grabbed Joseph by his tunic demanding 'Sleep with me right now!' But Joseph resisted. He wriggled out of his tunic and ran outside. When she saw that she still had his tunic in her hands, she made up this story for the other servants: 'Look! The Hebrew slave tried to assault me but I screamed, so he ran out of the house, but he left his tunic here!' When her husband came home, she gave him the same story. Potiphar burned with anger when he heard his wife's accusations. He arrested Joseph on the spot and dragged him off and threw him in the king's prison."
