SOLOMON'S WISDOM

8 Principles from Proverbs

1.

(Revelation) ("It is the Lord who gives <u>wisdom;</u> from him come <u>knowledge</u> and <u>understanding.</u> He provides <u>help</u> and <u>protection</u> for those who are righteous and honest." Proverbs 2:6-7 (TEV)

"A man is foolish to trust himself. But those who use God's wisdom are safe." Proverbs 28:26 (LB)

(Information) *"Every prudent man acts out of knowledge."* Proverbs 13:16 (NIV)

"How stupid to decide before knowing the facts!" Proverbs 18:13 (LB)

"Sensible people are careful to stay out of trouble, but stupid people are careless and act too quickly". Proverbs 14:16 (TEV)

(Consultation) "Plans succeed <u>through good counsel</u>; don't go to war without <u>the advice</u> of others." Proverbs 20:18 (NLT)

"Without advice plans go wrong, but with many advisers they succeed." Proverbs 15:22 (GW)

"The more advice you get, the more likely you are to win." Proverbs 24:6b (TEV)

ASK:

(Selection) 4.

"An intelligent person <u>aims</u> at wise action, but a fool starts off in many directions." Proverbs 17:24 (TEV)

"Look <u>straight ahead</u>, and <u>fix your eyes</u> on what lies before you. <u>Mark out a straight path</u> for your feet; then <u>stick to the path</u> and stay safe. Don't get sidetracked." Proverbs 4:25-27 (NLT)

(Evaluation) "It is foolish and rash to make a promise to the Lord before <u>counting the cost</u>." Proverbs 20:25 (LB)

6. (Preparation) "A sensible man <u>watches for problems ahead and prepares</u> to meet them. The simpleton never looks and suffers the consequences." Proverbs 22:3 (LB)

7. *(Confrontation) "Fear of man is a dangerous <u>trap</u>, but <u>to trust in God</u> means safety." Proverbs 29:25 (LB)*
